Scope of Work

- Dust all surfaces, including shelves, ledges, and equipment.
- Sanitise high-touch areas such as door handles and light switches.
- Vacuum or sweep floors to remove dust and debris.
- Mop floors using appropriate cleaning solutions.
- Empty rubbish bins and replace liners.
- Ensure all cleaning supplies are stored correctly and safely.
- Check for and report any signs of pest activity.

Method

- 1. Prepare the cleaning trolley with all necessary supplies and equipment, ensuring the use of colour-coded cleaning cloths
- 2. Dust all surfaces using a microfibre cloth, starting from the highest point and working downwards.
- 3. Sanitise high-touch areas with a disinfectant solution, allowing appropriate contact time.
- 4. Vacuum or sweep the floor thoroughly, paying attention to corners and edges.
- 5. Mop the floor using a damp mop and a neutral pH cleaner, ensuring no excess water is left on the floor.
- 6. Empty rubbish bins, replace liners, and dispose of waste according to facility protocols.
- 7. Inspect the area for cleanliness and ensure all supplies are returned to the storage area.

Quality Criteria

• Vacuum cleaner

Performance Level	Criteria
Excellent	All surfaces are free of dust and marks; floors are spotless and dry; no odours present; rubbish bins are empty and clean; all supplies are neatly organised.
Good	Minor dust on high surfaces; floors are clean with minimal streaks; faint odours may be present; rubbish bins are empty but may have minor residue.
Pass	Visible dust on surfaces; floors are clean but may have visible streaks; noticeable odours; rubbish bins are emptied but not cleaned.
Fail	Significant dust accumulation; floors are dirty or wet; strong odours present; rubbish bins are full or overflowing; supplies are disorganised.
